In 1998, two women with no formal background in education were moved by their faith in Christ to start a school where every student could receive an excellent education, regardless of their family's income.

Today, Logos Academy, an independent school accredited by the Middle States Association, serves 200 students in grades K-12. Two-thirds of these students live at or below the federal poverty line. Without the aid of government funding, generous donors give scholarships to make it possible for students who normally would not be able to afford tuition at Logos Academy to attend at just a fraction of the cost. Everybody pays something to attend and the results speak for themselves. Students across the economic and cultural spectrum succeed at Logos Academy and go on to a meaningful future professionally, academically, and spiritually.

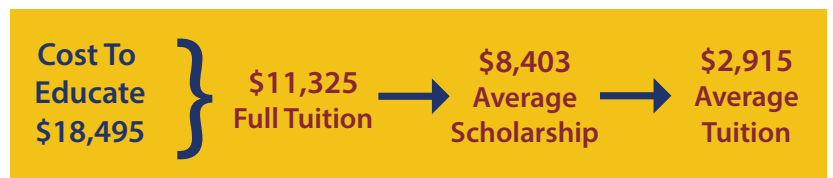
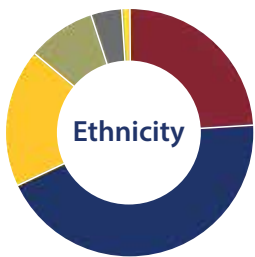


### Intelligence Plus Character

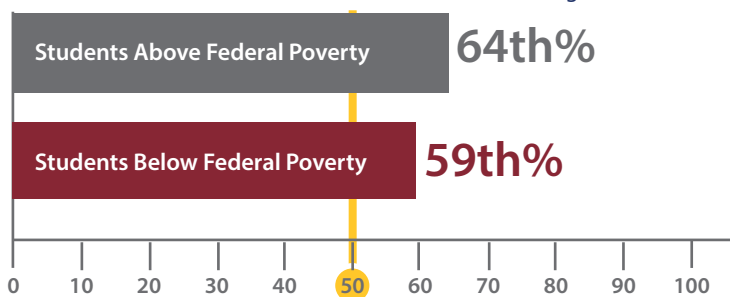
